coming. We know that One as the third person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit, which fell in a new way on Jesus' believing people 50 days after Easter. What greater gift can God bestow on His people than the gift of Himself. We don't walk alone. God above us. God beside us. God in us! The Comforter not only strengthens individual believers, He extends the work of Jesus by showing those outside the camp of salvation the truth of the Gospel and their need for a saviour.

THE COLLECT FOR EASTER 4

O ALMIGHTY God, who alone canst order the unruly wills and affections of sinful men; Grant unto thy people, that they may love the thing which thou commandest, and desire that which thou dost promise; that so, among the sundry and manifold changes of the world, our hearts may surely there be fixed, where true joys are to be found; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

THE EPISTLE (H.C.) – 1 St. James 1:17-21 (J.B. Phillips)

Your behavior in the outside world

EVERY good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning. Of his own will begat he us with the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures. Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath: for the wrath of man worketh not the righteousness of God. Wherefore lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

NOTE: Every good and perfect gift comes from the Father. One of God's gifts is that of a new life for those who turn to Him. This passage is a commentary on parts of the baptismal service. The baptized are new beings and "kind of first-fruit" of God's new creation. They are more likely to live according to the "righteousness of God" because they are prepared to hear and heed "the engrafted words" – God's commands. (William Sydnor)

THE GOSPEL (H.C.) – St. John 16:5-15 (J.B. Phillips)

Jesus promises the Spirit of truth

16 ⁵ Jesus said to his disciples, "Now the time has come for me to go away to the one who sent me. None of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' That is because you are so

distressed at what I have told you. Yet I am telling you the simple truth when I assure you that it is a good thing for you that I should go away. For if I did not go away, the divine helper would not come to you. But if I go, then I will send him to you. When he comes, he will convince the world of the meaning of sin, of true goodness and of judgment. He will expose their sin because they do not believe in me; he will reveal true goodness for I am going away to the Father and you will see me no longer; and he will show them the meaning of judgment, for the spirit which rules this world will have been judged.

¹²⁻¹⁵ "I have much more to tell you but you cannot bear it now. Yet when that one I have spoken to you about comes—the Spirit of truth—he will guide you into everything that is true. For he will not be speaking of his own accord but exactly as he hears, and he will inform you about what is to come. He will bring glory to me for he will draw on my truth and reveal it to you. Whatever the Father possesses is also mine; that is why I tell you that he will draw on my truth and will show it to you."

NOTE: In this part of the Upper Room discourses our Lord is promising the disciples that He will send them the Holy Spirit. Truly this is the greatest of all good gifts. (William Sydnor)

LECTIONARY READINGS

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON – Job 19:21-27 (RSV)

Job Replies: I Know That My Redeemer Lives

19²¹ Have pity on me, have pity on me, O you my friends, for the hand of God has touched me!

²² Why do you, like God, pursue me?

Why are you not satisfied with my flesh?

²³ "Oh that my words were written!

Oh that they were inscribed in a book!

²⁴Oh that with an iron pen and lead they were graven in the rock for ever!

²⁵ For I know that my Redeemer lives, and at last he will stand upon the earth;

²⁶ and after my skin has been thus destroyed, then from my flesh I shall see God,

²⁷ whom I shall see for myself,

and my eyes shall behold, and not another. My heart faints within me!

NOTE: This heart-rending, poignant passage is the high-water mark of Job's faith. It is a momentous expression of faith, perhaps the most significant one in the entire O.T. In spite of all the untoward things that have happened to him Job is unalterably certain that God, His Redeemer, is alive and able to save him. (William Sydnor)

In-church.




FUTURE FIFTH SUNDAY POTLUCKS DATES


