(Trinity 20)



Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us. Hebrews 12:1

Gaining strength and resolve from our spiritual forebearers

All Saints' celebrates exemplary, though not "perfect," Christians. It recognizes those in whom an aspect of God's grace shone so brightly that it inspired the acclaim of many. We commemorate the Patriarchs, the Prophets, and Mary, Joseph, the Apostles, and so many other biblical saints. We also commemorate the saints of the Christian Church, including martyrs like Perpetua, teachers like Augustine, and mystics like St. Teresa of Avila. But among these giants, we don't neglect all faithful believers, most of them who have not made the pages of history yet who are known of God and held in His care and who await the final resurrection at the last day.

This focus on those who have gone before helps us gain wisdom and strength for the living of these days. They remind us we are not the first Christians. Though hidden from our sight, the faithful in the past still speak. The Church consists of two parts: the Church militant on earth and the Church expectant in heaven. Only a thin veil separates the two. At Holy Communion, we join with those who have gone before when we say: "Therefore with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laude and magnify thy glorious Name: evermore praising thee, and saying, HOLY, HOLY, HOLY..."

COLLECT FOR ALL SAINTS' DAY

ALMIGHTY God, who hast knit together thine elect in one communion and fellowship, in the mystical body of thy Son Christ our Lord; Grant us grace so to follow thy blessed Saints in all virtuous and godly living, that we may come to those unspeakable joys which thou hast prepared for those who unfeignedly love thee; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

FOR THE EPISTLE – Revelation 7:2-4, 9-17 (J.B. Phillips)

Judgment stayed for the sealing of God's people

7 ¹⁻³ Later I saw four angels standing at the four corners of the earth holding in check the four winds of the earth that none should blow upon the earth or upon the sea or upon any tree. Then I saw another angel ascending out of the east, holding the seal of the

living God. He cried out in a loud voice to the four angels who had the power to harm the earth and the sea: "Do no harm to the earth, nor to the sea, nor to the trees until we have sealed the servants of our God upon their foreheads."

⁴⁻⁸ I heard the number of those who were thus sealed and it was 144,000, from every tribe of the sons of Israel. Twelve thousand were sealed from the tribe of Judah; twelve thousand from the tribe of Reuben; twelve thousand from the tribe of Naphtali; twelve thousand from the tribe of Manasseh; twelve thousand from the tribe of Simeon; twelve thousand from the tribe of Levi; twelve thousand from the tribe of Issachar; twelve thousand from the tribe of Zebulun; twelve thousand from the tribe of Joseph; and twelve thousand from the tribe of Benjamin.

The countless host of the redeemed

⁹⁻¹⁰ When this was done I looked again, and before my eyes appeared a vast crowd beyond man's power to number. They came from every nation and tribe and people and language, and they stood before the throne of the Lamb, dressed in white robes with palm-branches in their hands. With a great voice they shouted these words: "Salvation belongs to our God who sits upon the throne and to the Lamb!"

Then all the angels stood encircling the throne, the elders and the four living creatures, and prostrated themselves with heads bowed before the throne and worshipped God, saying, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and strength be given to our God for timeless ages!"

The countless host explained

¹³ Then one of the elders addressed me and asked, "These who are dressed in white robe—who are they, and where do they come from?!

^{14a} "You know, my Lord," I answered him.

^{14b-17} Then he told me, "These are those who have come through the great oppression: they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. That is why they now have their place before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple. He who sits upon the throne will be their shelter. They will never again know hunger or thirst. The sun shall never beat upon them, neither shall there be any scorching heat, for the Lamb who is in the centre of the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

THE GOSPEL (H.C.) – St. Matthew 5:1-12 (J.B. Phillips)

Jesus proclaims the new values of the kingdom

5 When Jesus saw the vast crowds he went up the hill-side and after he had sat down his disciples came to him.

²⁻¹² Then he began his teaching by saying to them, "How happy are the humble-minded, for the kingdom of Heaven is theirs! "How happy are those who know what sorrow means for they will be given courage and comfort! "Happy are those who claim nothing, for the whole earth will belong to them! "Happy are those who are hungry and thirsty for goodness, for they will be fully satisfied! "Happy are the merciful, for they will have mercy shown to them! "Happy are the utterly sincere, for they will see God! "Happy are those who make peace, for they will be sons of God! "Happy are those who have suffered persecution for the cause of goodness, for the kingdom of Heaven is theirs! "And what happiness will be yours when people blame you and ill-treat you and say all kinds of slanderous things against you for my sake! Be glad then, yes, be tremendously glad—for your reward in Heaven is magnificent. They persecuted the prophets before your time in exactly the same way.

NOTE: This is our Lord's description of those who have a place in the Kingdom of Heaven. (William Sydnor).

FIRST LESSON (Apocrypha) – Wisdom 3:1-9 (RSV)

The destiny of the righteous

- **3** But the souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them.
- ² In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died, and their departure was thought to be an affliction,
- ³ and their going from us to be their destruction; but they are at peace.
- ⁴ For though in the sight of men they were punished, their hope is full of immortality.
- ⁵ Having been disciplined a little, they will receive great good, because God tested them and found them worthy of himself;
- ⁶ like gold in the furnace he tried them, and like a sacrificial burnt offering he accepted them.
- ⁷ In the time of their visitation they will shine forth, and will run like sparks through the stubble.

⁸ They will govern nations and rule over peoples, and the Lord will reign over them for ever.

⁹ Those who trust in him will understand truth, and the faithful will abide with him in love, because grace and mercy are upon his elect, and he watches over his holy ones.

NOTE: The purpose of the section from which this passage comes is to encourage the readers to hold to their faith in spite of mockery and even persecution. This passage is a vindication of the godly lives and earthly sufferings of righteous men.




